## Genesis 33 keywords (including keywords from Genesis 32)

Now <u>Jacob looked up and saw</u> Esau coming, and four hundred men with him. So he divided the **children** among Leah and Rachel and the two secondary women. He put the secondary women with their **children** in front, then Leah with her **children**, and Rachel and Joseph last of all. He himself **passed on** ahead before their **faces**, **bowing** himself to the ground seven times, until he came near **his brother**.

**But Esau** ran to call him, and embraced him, and fell on his neck and kissed him, and he wept.

When <u>Esau looked up and saw</u> the women and **children**, he said, "Who are these with you?" Jacob said, "The **children** whom God has graciously given your servant." Then the secondary women drew near, they and their **children**, and **bowed** down; Leah likewise and her **children** drew near and **bowed** down; and finally Joseph and Rachel drew near, and they **bowed** down.

Esau said, "What do you mean by all this company that I met?" Jacob answered, "To find favor with my **lord**." But Esau said, "I have enough, my brother; keep what you have for yourself."

Jacob said, "No, **please**, no **please**! If I find favor with you, then <u>accept my present</u> from my hand;

for truly to see your **face** is like seeing the **face** of God--since you have received me with such favor.

<u>Please</u> <u>accept my blessing</u> that is brought to you, because God has dealt graciously with me, and

because I have everything I want." So he urged him, and he took it.

Then Esau said, "Let us journey on our way, and I will go alongside you." But Jacob said to him, "My lord knows that the children are frail and that the flocks and herds, which are nursing; and if they are overdriven for one day, all the flocks will die. Let my lord please pass on towad the faces of his servant, and I will lead on gently, according to the feet of the cattle that are before my face and according to the feet of the children, until I come to my lord in Seir." So Esau said, "Let me please leave with you some of the people who are with me." But he said, "Why should I obtain favor in your eyes?" So Esau returned that day on his way to Seir.

But Jacob journeyed to **Succoth**, and built himself a house, and made **booths** for his cattle; therefore the place is called **Succoth**. Jacob came safely to the city of Shechem, which is in the land of Canaan, on his way from Paddan-aram; and he camped at the **face** of the city. And from the sons of Hamor, Shechem's father, he bought for one hundred pieces of money the plot of land on which he had pitched his tent. There he erected an altar and called it El-Elohe-Israel.
