

## "Giving thanks" (eucharisteō) in Luke-Acts

Luke 17.16	He prostrated himself at Jesus' feet and <b>thanked</b> him. And he was a <u>Samaritan</u> .
Luke 18.11	<u>Pharisee</u> , standing by himself, was praying thus, 'God, <b>I thank you that I am not like other people</b> : thieves, rogues, adulterers, or even like this tax collector.'
Luke 22.17, 19	Then [ <u>Jesus</u> ] <u>took a cup</u> , and after <b>giving thanks</b> he said, "Take this and divide it among yourselves...Then he <u>took a loaf of bread</u> , and when he <b>had given thanks</b> , he broke it and gave it to them, saying, "This is my body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me."
Acts 27.35	After [ <u>Paul</u> ] had said this, <u>he took bread; and giving thanks</u> to God in the presence of all, he broke it and began to eat.
Acts 28.15	The believers from there, when they heard of us, came as far as the Forum of Appius and Three Taverns to meet us. On seeing them, <u>Paul thanked God and took courage</u> .
