- 4. With whom is Jacob wrestling: God? Esau? His inner self? A river spirit?
- 5. What is the nature of Jacob's injury? If his "hip" is "dislocated," how can he walk away?
- 6. Why does the already blessed Jacob insist on receiving a blessing from the wrestler?
- 7. Why the name change to "Israel"?
