

“Settling”/“sitting”/“remaining” [Hebrew, *yshb*] in 2 Samuel

1.1	After the death of Saul, when David had returned from defeating the Amalekites, <u>David</u> settled <u>two days</u> in Ziklag.
2.2	David brought up <u>the men who were with him</u> , every one with his household; and they settled <u>in the towns of Hebron</u> .
2.13	Joab son of Zeruiah, and the servants of David, went out and met them at the pool of Gibeon. One group settled <u>on one side of the pool</u> , while the other on the other side of the pool.
5.6	The king and his men marched to Jerusalem against the Jebusites, the settlers <u>of the land</u> ...
5.9	David settled <u>in the stronghold</u> , and named it the city of David.
6.2	David and all the people with him set out and went from Baale-judah, to bring up from there the ark of God, which is called by the name of YHWH of hosts who is settled <u>on the cherubim</u> .
6.11	The ark of YHWH settled <u>in the house of Obed-edom the Gittite</u> three months;
7.1-2	Now when the king was settled <u>in his house</u> , and YHWH had given him rest from all his enemies around him, the king said to the prophet Nathan, "See now, I am settling <u>in a house of cedar</u> , but the ark of God settles <u>in a tent</u> ."
7.5-6	Go and tell my servant David: Thus says YHWH: Are you the one to build me <u>a house to settle in</u> ? I <u>have not settled in a house</u> since the day I brought up the people of Israel from Egypt to this day, but I have been moving about in a tent and a tabernacle."
7.18	Then <u>King David</u> went in and settled <u>before YHWH</u> , and said, "Who am I, O Lord YHWH, and what is my house, that you have brought me thus far?"
9.13	<u>Mephibosheth</u> settled <u>in Jerusalem</u> , for he always ate at the king's table.
10.5	When David was told, he sent to meet them, for the men were greatly ashamed. <u>The king said</u> , " Settle <u>at Jericho until your beards have grown</u> , and then return."
11.1	In the spring of the year, the time when kings go out to battle, David sent Joab with his officers and all Israel with him; they ravaged the Ammonites, and besieged Rabbah. But <u>David</u> settled <u>at Jerusalem</u> .
11.11-12	Uriah said to David, " <u>The ark and Israel and Judah settle in booths</u> ; and my lord Joab and the servants of my lord are camping in the open field; shall I then go to my house, to eat and to drink, and to lie with my wife? As you live, and as your being lives, I will not do such a thing." Then David said to Uriah, " Settle <u>here today also</u> , and tomorrow I will send you back." So <u>Uriah</u> settled <u>in Jerusalem</u> that day.
13.20	So <u>Tamar</u> settled , a desolate woman, <u>in her brother Absalom's house</u> .
14.28	So <u>Absalom</u> settled <u>two full years in Jerusalem</u> , without coming into the king's presence.
15.8	For your servant [<u>Absalom</u>] made a vow while I settled <u>at Geshur in Aram</u> : If YHWH will indeed bring me to settle <u>in Jerusalem</u> , then I will worship YHWH in Hebron."
15.19	Then the <u>king</u> said to Ittai the Gittite, "Why are you also coming with us? Go back, and settle <u>with the king</u> ; for you are a foreigner, and also an exile from your home."
15.29	So <u>Zadok and Abiathar</u> carried the ark of God back to Jerusalem, and they settled <u>there</u> .
16.3	The king said, "And <u>where is your master's son</u> ?" Ziba said to the king, "He is settled <u>in Jerusalem</u> ; for he said, 'Today the house of Israel will give me back my grandfather's kingdom.'"
16.18	Hushai said to Absalom, "No; <u>but the one whom YHWH and this people and all the Israelites have chosen</u> , his I will be, and with him I will settle ."
18.24	Now <u>David</u> was settling <u>between the two gates</u> . The sentinel went up to the roof of the gate by the wall, and when he looked up, he saw a man running alone.
19.8	Then the <u>king</u> got up and settled <u>in the gate</u> . The troops were all told, "See, the king is settling <u>in the gate</u> "; and all the troops came before the king. Meanwhile, all the Israelites had fled to their homes.
