

## “Evil” (*ra` = green; ra`ah = blue*) in Genesis

2.9, 17	tree of the knowledge of good and <b>evil</b> .
3.5	“God knows that when you eat of it your eyes will be opened, and you will be like God, knowing good and <b>evil</b> .”
3.22	Then YHWH God said, “See, the man has become like one of us, knowing good and <b>evil</b> ”
4.2	Abel was a <b>keeper</b> of sheep
6.5	YHWH saw that the wickedness of humankind was great in the earth,
6.5	every inclination of the thoughts of their hearts was only <b>evil</b> continually.
8.21	“I will never again curse the ground because of humankind, for the inclination of the human heart is <b>evil</b> from youth
13.7,8	there was <b>strife</b> between the herders of Abram's livestock and the herders of Lot's livestock.
13.13	Now the people of Sodom were <b>wicked</b> , great sinners against YHWH

48.16	the angel who has redeemed me from all <b>harm</b>
49.24	Mighty One of Jacob, by the name of the <b>Shepherd</b> , the Rock of Israel,
50.15, 17, 20	“What if Joseph still bears a grudge against us and pays us back in full for all the <b>wrong</b> that we did to him?”
