## Some Greco-Roman views of the afterlife

- 1. **HOMER**: As "shades" (*skiai*), "ghosts" (*psuchai*), "phantoms" (*eidola*): living a shadowy existence in the underworld (Hades), occasionally visible to the living.
- 2. **POETS**: pictures of ongoing life as "normal" beyond the grave
- 3. **PLATO (GREEK) AND SENECA (ROMAN):** the immortality of the "soul" (*psuchē*) released from "imprisonment" in the body
- 4. **Stoics (E.C., Cicero):** temporary afterlife for the "soul" until the rebirth of the universe in a primitive fire, other than some "virtuous" who would experience unending joy among the stars
- 5. **Divination of EMPERORS** alongside "gods" and "heroes"
- 6. EPICUREANS (E.G., LUCRETIUS): denial of, even mockery of, any afterlife
- 7. VARIETY OF POPULAR VIEWS: most people did (do) not read philosophers, poets or propagandists ©
