David's women and children and Absalom's return to Geshur

Sons were born to David at Hebron: his firstborn was <u>Amnon</u>, of Ahinoam of Jezreel; his second, Chileab, of Abigail the widow of Nabal of Carmel; the third, <u>Absalom</u> <u>son of Maacah, daughter of King Talmai of Geshur*</u>; the fourth, <u>Adonijah</u> son of Haggith; the fifth, Shephatiah son of Abital; and the sixth, Ithream, of David's woman Eglah. These were born to David in Hebron. (2 Samuel 3.2-5)

Jerusalem, after he came from Hebron, David took more concubines and wives; and more sons and daughters were born to David. **These are the names of those who were born to him in Jerusalem**: Shammua, Shobab, Nathan, <u>Solomon</u>, Ibhar, Elishua, Nepheg, Japhia, Elishama, Eliada, and Eliphelet. (2 Samuel 5.13-16)

*<u>Absalom fled, and went to Talmai son of Ammihud, king of Geshur</u>. Absalom, having fled to Geshur, stayed there three years. (2 Samuel 13.37-38)

Absalom to David: "For your servant made a vow <u>while I lived at Geshur in Aram</u>^: If YHWH will indeed bring me back to Jerusalem, then I will worship YHWH in Hebron." (2 Samuel 15.8)

^David put garrisons among the Arameans of Damascus; and <u>the Arameans be-</u> <u>came servants to David and brought tribute</u>. (2 Samuel 8.6)

The <u>Arameans arrayed themselves against David</u> and fought with him. The Arameans fled before Israel; and <u>David killed of the Arameans seven hundred chariot</u> <u>teams, and forty thousand horsemen</u>, and wounded Shobach the commander of their army, so that he died there. (2 Samuel 10.17b-18)

[Neither "Aram" or "Arameans" mentioned again in 2 Samuel after these references.]
