

## Baptism in Acts

1.5	"John <b>baptized</b> with <u>water</u> , but <b>you will be baptized</b> with the <u>Holy Spirit</u> not many days from now."
2.38, 41	Peter said to them, " <u>Repent</u> , and <b>be baptized</b> every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ so that your sins may be forgiven; and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit.... So <u>those who welcomed his message</u> <b>were baptized</b> , and that day about three thousand persons were added.
8.12-13, 36, 38	But when [ <u>Samaritans</u> ] believed Philip, who was proclaiming the good news about the kingdom of God and the name of Jesus Christ, <b>they were baptized</b> , both men and women. Even Simon himself believed. After being baptized, he stayed constantly with Philip and was amazed when he saw the signs and great miracles that took place....As they were going along the road, they came to some water; and the eunuch said, "Look, here is water! What is to prevent me from being baptized?" He commanded the chariot to stop, and both of them, Philip and the <u>eunuch</u> , went down into the water, and Philip <b>baptized</b> him.
9.18	And immediately something like scales fell from [ <u>Saul's</u> ] eyes, and his sight was restored. Then he got up and <b>was baptized</b>
10.47-48	"Can anyone withhold the water for <b>baptizing</b> these [ <u>faithful from the circumcision</u> ] who have received the Holy Spirit just as we have?" So he ordered them <b>to be baptized</b> in the name of Jesus Christ. Then they invited him to stay for several days.
11.16	And I [ <u>Peter</u> ] remembered the word of the Lord, how he had said, 'John <b>baptized</b> with water, but <b>you will be baptized</b> with the Holy Spirit.'
16.15	When [ <u>Lydia</u> ] and her household <b>were baptized</b> , she urged us, saying, "If you have judged me to be faithful to the Lord, come and stay at my home." And she prevailed upon us.
16.33	At the same hour of the night [ <u>the jailer in Philippi</u> ] took them and washed their wounds; then he and <u>his entire family</u> <b>were baptized</b> without delay.
18.8	Crispus, the official of the synagogue, became a believer in the Lord, together with all his household; and <u>many of the Corinthians</u> who heard Paul became believers and <b>were baptized</b> .
19.2-5	[Paul] said to [ <u>some disciples in Ephesus</u> ], "Did you receive the Holy Spirit when you became believers?" They replied, "No, we have not even heard that there is a Holy Spirit." Then he said, "Into what then were you baptized?" They answered, "Into John's baptism." Paul said, "John baptized with the baptism of repentance, telling the people to believe in the one who was to come after him, that is, in Jesus." On hearing this, <b>they were baptized</b> in the name of the Lord Jesus.
22.6	[Paul, <u>testifying to his experience</u> before the Roman guard in Jerusalem] "And now why do you delay? Get up, <b>be baptized</b> , and have your sins washed away, calling on his name."
