

Prayer in Acts

	Collective	Peter/John	Paul/Barnabas/others	Others
1.14	All these continued in prayer <u>with one mind</u> .			
1.24	Then they prayed and said, "Lord, you know everyone's heart. Show us which one of these two you have chosen..."			
2.42	<u>They devoted themselves</u> to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers .			
3.1	One day Peter and John were going up to the temple at the <u>hour of prayer</u> , at three o'clock in the afternoon.			
6.3-4, 6	"Therefore, friends, select from among yourselves seven men of good standing, full of the Spirit and of wisdom, whom we may appoint to this task, while we, for our part, will devote ourselves to prayer and to serving the word!"... They had these men stand before the <u>apostles</u> , who prayed and laid their hands on them.			
8.15	[Peter and John] went down and prayed for them that they might receive the Holy Spirit			
9.11	The Lord said to [Ananias], "Get up and go to the street called Straight, and at the house of Judas look for a <u>man of Tarsus named Saul</u> . At this moment he is praying... "			
9.40	<u>Peter</u> put all of them outside, and then he knelt down and prayed . [scene recalled at 11.5ff]			
10.4	[Angel to <u>Cornelius</u>] answered, "Your prayers and your alms have ascended as a memorial before God." [recalled at 10.30-31]			
10.9	About noon the next day, as they were on their journey and approaching the city, <u>Peter</u> went up on the roof to pray .			
12.5	While Peter was kept in prison, the <u>church</u> prayed fervently to God for him.			
12.12	As soon as he realized this, he went to the house of Mary, the mother of John whose other name was Mark, where <u>many had gathered</u> and were praying .			
13.3	Then after fasting and praying [<u>the church at Antioch</u> laid their hands on Barnabas and Saul] and sent them off.			
14.23	And after [<u>Paul and Barnabas</u>] had appointed elders for them in each church, with prayer and fasting they entrusted them to the Lord in whom they had come to believe.			
16.13	On the sabbath day we went outside the gate by the river, where we supposed there was a <u>place of prayer</u> ; and we sat down and spoke to the women who had gathered there. [again, 16.16]			
20.36	When [<u>Paul</u>] had finished speaking, he knelt down with them all and prayed .			
21.5-6a	When our days there were ended, we left and proceeded on our journey; and all of them, with women and children, escorted us outside the city. There <u>we</u> knelt down on the beach and prayed and said farewell to one another.			
22.17	"After I [<u>Paul</u>] had returned to Jerusalem and while I was praying in the temple..."			
28.18	It so happened that the father of Publius lay sick in bed with fever and dysentery. <u>Paul</u> visited him and cured him by praying and putting his hands on him.
