

“Hebron” in Samuel
David and his people = purple Saulides/Absalom = blue

1 Sam 30.31	in Hebron [and] all the places where David and his men had roamed [he distributed spoils of war]
All others in 2 Samuel	
2.1, 3	After this David inquired of YHWH, "Shall I go up into any of the cities of Judah?" YHWH said to him, "Go up." David said, "To which shall I go up?" He said, "To Hebron ..." and <u>they settled in the towns of Hebron</u> .
2.11	The time that <u>David was king in Hebron</u> over the house of Judah was seven years and six months.
2.32	Joab and his men marched all night, and the <u>day broke upon them at Hebron</u> .
3.2-6	<u>Sons were born to David at Hebron</u> : his firstborn was Amnon, of Ahinoam of Jezreel; his second, Chileab, of Abigail the widow of Nabal of Carmel; the third, Absalom son of Maacah, daughter of King Talmi of Geshur; the fourth, Adonijah son of Haggith; the fifth, Shephatiah son of Abital; and the sixth, Ithream, of David's wife Eglah. These were born to David in Hebron .
3.12	<u>Abner sent messengers to David at Hebron</u> , saying, "To whom does the land belong? Make your covenant with me, and I will give you my support to bring all Israel over to you."
3.19-20, 22	Abner also spoke directly to the Benjaminites; then <u>Abner went to tell David at Hebron</u> all that Israel and the whole house of Benjamin were ready to do. When <u>Abner came with twenty men to David at Hebron</u> , David made a feast for Abner and the men who were with him...But <u>Abner was not with David at Hebron</u> , for David had dismissed him, and he had gone away in peace.
3.27, 32	When <u>Abner returned to Hebron</u> , Joab took him aside in the gateway to speak with him privately, and there he stabbed him in the stomach. So he died for shedding the blood of Asahel, Joab's brother...They buried Abner at Hebron .
4.1	When Saul's son Ishbaal heard that <u>Abner had died at Hebron</u> , his courage failed, and all Israel was dismayed.
4.8	They brought the <u>head of Ishbaal to David at Hebron</u>
4.12	So David commanded the young men, and they killed [the messengers of Saul's death]; they cut off their hands and feet, and hung their bodies beside the pool at Hebron . But the <u>head of Ishbaal they took and buried in the tomb of Abner at Hebron</u> .
5.1, 3, 5	Then <u>all the tribes of Israel came to David at Hebron</u> , and said, "Look, we are your bone and flesh." ...So all the <u>elders of Israel came to the king at Hebron</u> ; and King David <u>made a covenant with them at Hebron</u> before YHWH, and they anointed David king over Israel. At Hebron <u>he reigned over Judah seven years and six months</u> ; and at Jerusalem he reigned over all Israel and Judah thirty-three years.
5.13	<u>In Jerusalem, after he came from Hebron</u> , David took more concubines and wives; and more sons and daughters were born to David.
15.7-10	At the end of four years <u>Absalom said to the king</u> , "Please let me go to Hebron and pay the vow that I have made to YHWH. For your servant made a vow while I lived at Geshur in Aram: If YHWH will indeed bring me back to Jerusalem, <u>then I will worship YHWH in Hebron</u> ." The king said to him, "Go in peace." So <u>he got up and went to Hebron</u> . But Absalom sent secret messengers throughout all the tribes of Israel, saying, "As soon as you hear the sound of the trumpet, then shout: <u>Absalom has become king at Hebron!</u> "
