

## Gileadites in the Bible

Deuteronomy 3.12-13a	As for the land that we took possession of at that time, <b>I gave to the Reubenites and Gadites</b> the territory north of Aroer, that is on the edge of the Wadi Arnon, as well as <b>half the hill country of Gilead with its towns</b> , and I <b>gave to the half-tribe of Manasseh the rest of Gilead</b> and all of Bashan, Og's kingdom.
Num 26.29	<b>The descendants of Manasseh:</b> of Machir, the clan of the Machirites; and <b>Machir was the father of Gilead; of Gilead, the clan of the Gileadites.</b>
Judges 10.3	After him came <b>Jair the Gileadite, who judged Israel twenty-two years.</b>
Judges 11.1	Now <b>Jephthah the Gileadite, the son of a prostitute, was a mighty warrior.</b> Gilead was the father of Jephthah. (also, 11.40; 12.7)
2 Samuel 17.27-29	When David came to Mahanaim, Shobi son of Nahash from Rabbah of the Ammonites, and Machir son of Ammiel from Lo-debar, and <b>Barzillai the Gileadite from Rogelim, brought beds, basins, and earthen vessels, wheat, barley, meal, parched grain, beans and lentils, honey and curds, sheep, and cheese from the herd, for David and the people with him to eat;</b> for they said, "The troops are hungry and weary and thirsty in the wilderness."
2 Samuel 19.31ff	Now <b>Barzillai the Gileadite had come down from Rogelim;</b> he went on with the king to the Jordan, to escort him over the Jordan.
1 Kings 2.7	<b>[David to Solomon] "Deal loyally, however, with the sons of Barzillai the Gileadite,</b> and let them be among those who eat at your table; for with such loyalty they met me when I fled from your brother Absalom."
1 Kings 17.1	<b>Elijah the Tishbite, of Tishbe in Gilead...</b>
2 Kings 15.25	<b>Pekah son of Remaliah, his captain, conspired against [King Azariah of Judah] with fifty of the Gileadites, and attacked him in Samaria,</b> in the citadel of the palace along with Argob and Arieah; he killed him, and reigned in place of him.
Ezra 2.61; Nehemiah 7.63	[in the list of returned exiles] Also, of the descendants of the priests: the descendants of Habaiah, Hakkoz, and <b>Barzillai (who had married one of the daughters of Barzillai the Gileadite and was called by their name).</b>
