

The Sanhedrin in Acts

4.15	So they ordered [Peter and John] to leave the Sanhedrin while they discussed the matter with one another.
5.21, 27, 34, 41	When the high priest and those with him arrived, they called together the Sanhedrin and the whole body of the elders of Israel, and sent to the prison to have [the apostles] brought....When they had brought them, they had them stand before the SanhedrinBut a Pharisee in the Sanhedrin named Gamaliel, a teacher of the law, respected by all the people, stood up and ordered the men to be put outside for a short time....they left the Sanhedrin , they rejoiced that they were considered worthy to suffer dishonor for the sake of the name.
6.12, 15	They stirred up the people as well as the elders and the scribes; then they suddenly confronted [Stephen], seized him, and brought him before the SanhedrinAnd all who sat in the Sanhedrin looked intently at him, and they saw that his face was like the face of an angel.
22.30-23.1, 6	Since he wanted to find out what Paul was being accused of by the Judeans, the next day he released him and ordered the chief priests and the entire Sanhedrin to meet. He brought Paul down and had him stand before them. While Paul was looking intently at the Sanhedrin he said, "Brothers, up to this day I have lived my life with a clear conscience before God."... When Paul noticed that some were Sadducees and others were Pharisees, he called out in the Sanhedrin , "Brothers, I am a Pharisee, a son of Pharisees. I am on trial concerning the hope of the resurrection of the dead."
23.15, 20	[Judeans who are bound to kill Paul] "Now then, you and the Sanhedrin must notify the tribune to bring him down to you, on the pretext that you want to make a more thorough examination of his case. And we are ready to do away with him before he arrives."... He answered, "The Judeans have agreed to ask you to bring Paul down to the Sanhedrin tomorrow, as though they were going to inquire more thoroughly into his case."
23.28	["Claudius Lysias to his Excellency the governor Felix]: "Since I wanted to know the charge for which they accused [Paul], I had him brought to their Sanhedrin ."
24.20	"Or let these [Judeans from Asia] here tell what crime they had found when I [Paul] stood before the Sanhedrin "
