

Moses in Acts (outside Stephen's speech)

2.22-23	<p>Moses said, 'The Lord your God will raise up for you from your own people a prophet like me. You must listen to whatever he tells you. And it will be that everyone who does not listen to that prophet will be utterly rooted out of the people.'</p>
6.11, 14	<p>Then they secretly instigated some men to say, "<u>We have heard him speak blasphemous words against Moses and God...</u> we have heard him say that this Jesus of Nazareth will destroy this place and <u>will change the customs that Moses handed on to us.</u>"</p>
13.39	<p>"by this Jesus everyone who believes is set free from all those sins from which you could not be freed by the <u>law of Moses.</u>"</p>
15.1-2	<p>Then certain individuals came down from Judea and were teaching the brothers, "<u>Unless you are circumcised according to the custom of Moses,</u> you cannot be saved." And after Paul and Barnabas had no small dissension and debate with them, Paul and Barnabas and some of the others were appointed to go up to Jerusalem to discuss this question with the apostles and the elders.</p>
15.21	<p>"For in every city, for generations past, <u>Moses has had those who proclaim him,</u> for he has been read aloud every sabbath in the synagogues."</p>
21.21	<p>"They have been told about you [Paul] that you teach all the Judeans living among the Gentiles <u>to forsake Moses,</u> and that you tell them not to circumcise their children or observe the customs."</p>
26.22-23	<p>"To this day I [Paul] have had help from God, and so I stand here, testifying to both small and great, saying nothing but <u>what the prophets and Moses said would take place: that the Messiah must suffer,</u> and that, by being the first to rise from the dead, he would proclaim light both to our people and to the Gentiles."</p>
