

## Claiming Solomon in 1 Kings 1-2

1.12	[Nathan to Bathsheba] Now therefore come, let me give you advice, so that you may save your own life and the life of <b>your son Solomon</b> .
1.13	[Nathan to Bathsheba] Go in at once to King David, and say to him, 'Did you not, my lord the king, swear to your servant, saying: <b>Your son Solomon</b> shall succeed me as king, and he shall sit on my throne? Why then is Adonijah king?'
1.17	[Bathsheba] said to [David], "My lord, you swore to your servant by YHWH your God, saying: <b>Your son Solomon</b> shall succeed me as king, and he shall sit on my throne.
1.19	[Bathsheba to David] "your <b>slave</b> Solomon he has not invited."
1.21	[Bathsheba to David] ...when my lord the king sleeps with his ancestors, that <b>my son Solomon</b> and I will be counted offenders."
1.26	[Nathan to David] But he did not invite me, your servant, and the priest Zadok, and Benaiah son of Jehoiada, and your <b>slave</b> Solomon.
1.30	[David to Bathsheba] "as I swore to you by YHWH, the God of Israel, ' <b>Your son Solomon</b> shall succeed me as king, and he shall sit on my throne in my place,' so will I do this day."
1.33	the king said to [Zadok, Nathan and Benaiah], "Take with you the servants of your lord, and have <b>my son Solomon</b> ride on my own mule, and bring him down to Gihon."
2.1	When David's time to die drew near, he charged <b>his son Solomon</b> , saying...
