

Egypt in and around the Solomon narrative

Pink = Solomon/Egypt orange = Exodus recalls

blue = Solomon opponents/Egypt

3.1	Solomon made a marriage alliance with Pharaoh king of Egypt; he took Pharaoh's daughter and brought her into the city of David, until he had finished building his own house and the house of YHWH and the wall around Jerusalem.
4.21	Solomon was sovereign over all the kingdoms from the Euphrates to the land of the Philistines, <u>even to the border of Egypt</u> ; they brought tribute and served Solomon all the days of his life.
4.30	Solomon's wisdom surpassed the wisdom of all the people of the east, and all the <u>wisdom of Egypt</u> .
6.1	In the four hundred eightieth year <u>after the Israelites came out of the land of Egypt</u> , in the fourth year of Solomon's reign over Israel, in the month of Ziv, which is the second month, he began to build the house of YHWH.
7.8b	Solomon also made a house like this hall for Pharaoh's daughter , whom he had taken in marriage.
8.9	There was nothing in the ark except the two tablets of stone that Moses had placed there at Horeb, where YHWH made a covenant with the Israelites, <u>when they came out of the land of Egypt</u> .
8.16	[Solomon "quoting" YHWH] "'Since the day that I brought my people Israel out of Egypt , I have not chosen a city from any of the tribes of Israel in which to build a house, that my name might be there; but I chose David to be over my people Israel.'"
8.21	There I have provided a place for the ark, in which is the covenant of YHWH that he made with our ancestors when he brought them out of the land of Egypt ."
8.51	they are your people and heritage, <u>which you brought out of Egypt</u> , from the midst of the iron-smelter.
8.53	For you have separated them from among all the peoples of the earth, to be your heritage, just as you promised through Moses, your servant, when <u>you brought our ancestors out of Egypt</u> , O Lord YHWH."
8.65	So Solomon held the festival at that time, and all Israel with him-- a great assembly , people from Lebo-hamath <u>to the Wadi of Egypt</u> --before YHWH our God, seven days.
9.9	Then they will say, 'Because they have forsaken YHWH their God, who <u>brought their ancestors out of the land of Egypt</u> , and embraced other gods, worshiping them and serving them; therefore YHWH has brought this disaster upon them.'"
9.16-19	Pharaoh king of Egypt had gone up and captured Gezer and burned it down, had killed the Canaanites who lived in the city, and had given it as dowry to his daughter, Solomon's woman; so Solomon rebuilt Gezer, Lower Beth-horon, Baalath, Tamar in the wilderness, within the land, as well as all of Solomon's storage cities, the cities for his chariots, the cities for his cavalry, and whatever Solomon desired to build, in Jerusalem, in Lebanon, and in all the land of his dominion.
9.24	Pharaoh's daughter went up from the city of David to her own house that Solomon had built for her; then he built the Millo.

10.28-29	Solomon's import of horses was from Egypt and Kue, and the king's traders received them from Kue at a price. A chariot could be imported from Egypt for six hundred shekels of silver, and a horse for one hundred fifty; so through the king's traders they were exported to all the kings of the Hittites and the kings of Aram.
11.1-2	King Solomon loved many foreign women along with the daughter of Pharaoh: Moabite, Ammonite, Edomite, Sidonian, and Hittite women, from the nations concerning which the LORD had said to the Israelites, "You shall not enter into marriage with them, neither shall they with you; for they will surely incline your heart to follow their gods"; Solomon clung to these in love.
11.17-22	but Hadad fled to Egypt with some Edomites who were servants of his father. He was a young boy at that time. They set out from Midian and came to Paran; they took people with them from Paran and came to Egypt, to Pharaoh king of Egypt , who gave him a house, assigned him an allowance of food, and gave him land. Hadad found great favor in the sight of Pharaoh, so that he gave him his sister-in-law for a wife, the sister of Queen Tahpenes . The sister of Tahpenes gave birth by him to his son Genubath, whom Tahpenes weaned in Pharaoh's house; Genubath was in Pharaoh's house among the children of Pharaoh. When <u>Hadad heard in Egypt that David slept with his ancestors and that Joab the commander of the army was dead</u> , <u>Hadad said to Pharaoh</u> , "Let me depart, that I may go to my own country." <u>But Pharaoh said to him</u> , "What do you lack with me that you now seek to go to your own country?" And he said, "No, do let me go."
11.40	Solomon sought therefore to kill Jeroboam; but Jeroboam promptly fled to <u>Egypt, to King Shishak of Egypt</u> , and remained in Egypt until the death of Solomon.
12.1-2	Rehoboam went to Shechem, for all Israel had come to Shechem to make him king. When Jeroboam son of Nebat heard of it (for he was still in Egypt, where he had fled from King Solomon), then Jeroboam returned from Egypt .
12.28	[Jeroboam] took counsel and made two calves of gold. He said to the people, "You have gone up to Jerusalem long enough. <u>Here are your gods, O Israel, who brought you up out of the land of Egypt.</u> "
14.25-26	In the fifth year of King Rehoboam, King Shishak of Egypt came up against Jerusalem; he took away the treasures of the house of YHWH and the treasures of the king's house; he took everything. He also took away all the shields of gold that Solomon had made...
