

Hebrew words for YHWH's habitation

<i>bayit</i> YHWH, "house of YHWH," 240x in MT	7x in 1 Kings 6-7; 9x in 1 Kings 8-10	only 23.19; 34.26 in Exodus
<i>haychal</i>, "palace" or "temple," 80x in MT	6x in 1 Kings 6-7; not elsewhere in Solomon story	not in Exodus
<i>mishkan</i>, "tabernacle," 139x in MT	only Joshua 22.19; 2 Samuel 7.6 in Deut-2 Kings (DH)	58x in Exodus 25-40

Some mixed uses:

Psalm 26.8: O YHWH, I love the house [*bayit*] in which you dwell, and the place [*mishkan*] where your glory abides.

2 Samuel 7: "I have not lived in a house [*bayit*] since the day I brought up the people of Israel from Egypt to this day, but I have been moving about in a tent and a tabernacle [*mishkan*]."

Jeremiah 7.4: Do not trust in these deceptive words: "This is the temple [*haychal*] of YHWH, the temple of YHWH, the temple of YHWH."

Jeremiah 9.18: For a sound of wailing is heard from Zion: "How we are ruined! We are utterly shamed, because we have left the land, because they have cast down our dwellings [*mishkan*]."

Ezekiel 37.27: My dwelling place [*mishkan*] shall be with them; and I will be their God, and they shall be my people.

Ezekiel 41.4-5: He measured the depth of the room, twenty cubits, and its width, twenty cubits, beyond the nave [*haychal*]. And he said to me, This is the most holy place. Then he measured the wall of the temple, six cubits thick; and the width of the side chambers, four cubits, all around the temple [*bayit*].
